


TODAY'S TIP: Public Outings - Provided by Chelsea Stotler, Alexa's PLAYC Teacher

Public outings may be a source of stress for some parents with children with ASD, especially when having to deal with challenging behaviors in public. Try to plan your stops in advance, create a schedule for your child and intersperse preferred activities to keep your child motivated. If behavior problems arise, make sure your child is safe, but follow through with demands as you would in the home setting.

RESEARCH CORNER

Autism Model of Implementation – Dr. Amy Drahota was recently awarded a 5-year grant from the National Institutes of Mental Health entitled, *Developing the Autism Model of Implementation for ASD Community Providers*. By collaborating with ASD community providers, this study will develop the Autism Model of Implementation (AMI), a systematic process to efficiently implement new treatments in community-based agencies serving children with autism. Currently, ASD agency leaders are being recruited to participate in a questionnaire study to gather data about how agencies determine whether they need to adopt a new treatment and the process used to implement new treatments. Information from this study will help inform the development of the AMI. Once developed, a pilot test of the AMI will be conducted to implement an evidence-based intervention in participating agencies.
