Each year at the Annual Meeting, the Board of Trustees presents three Physicians of Excellence awards to honor outstanding achievements. This year, winners of the Physicians of Excellence Awards include:



Dr. John Bradley
Excellence in Teaching
Dr. Bradley has been the
Division Chief of Infectious
Diseases at Rady Children's for the
past 24 years. He has received four
teaching awards for his work with
UC San Diego students and

residents, and has been a mentor to a number of pediatric infectious diseases fellowship trainees. Dr. Bradley also served on the American Board of Pediatrics committee that was responsible for writing the certifying exam for physicians in the subspecialty of pediatric infectious diseases. Recently, he was named to the National Biodefense Science Board.



Dr. Ken Lyons Jones
Excellence in Research
Dr. Jones is renown for his
extensive work as a
dysmorphologist and clinical
teratologist. He is involved in
efforts to improve policies
regarding drug safety during

pregnancy, both in California and at the federal level. He is also involved in active clinical and epidemiological research programs in California and collaborates with scientists at Boston University, as well as in Australia, South Africa, Russia, Ukraine, Mexico and Brazil. Dr. Jones maintains a strong commitment to teaching as professor of pediatrics at UC San Diego and participates in many programs for trainees in the areas of pediatrics, epidemiology, and behavioral health, as well as in the School of Pharmacy. Additionally, he is an investigator in the National Children's Study, though his primary focus is to better understand the etiology and developmental pathogenesis of birth defects.



Dr. Marilyn Jones
Excellence in Clinical Care
Since 1979, Dr. Jones has been the
Director of Dysmorphology and
Genetics at Rady Children's. In
1981, she assumed the
directorship of the Cleft Palate
Program and the Craniofacial
Treatment Program at UC San

Diego, which is now located at the Hospital. She also serves as a professor of clinical pediatrics at UC San Diego and maintains an active research interest in the etiology and pathogenesis of clefting and craniofacial disorders. Her work in cleft lip and palate, craniofacial abnormalities and all aspects of birth defects have earned her numerous awards and honors over the years, including the Distinguished Service Award from the American Cleft Palate-Craniofacial Association in 2003.

These three physicians will also be recognized by Rady Children's Hospital on the Physician Recognition Wall in the lobby of the Hospital's Rose Pavilion.

### Dr. John Bradley Named to New National Biodefense Science Board

Our very own John Bradley, M.D., Infectious Disease Specialist, is now among seven experts from outside the federal government selected to join the National Biodefense Science Board (NBSB), a federal advisory committee which provides expert advice and guidance on preventing, preparing for, and responding to adverse health effects of public health emergencies to the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services' Secretary and the HHS Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response (ASPR). The new members replaced members whose four-year terms expired January 31.



The ASPR serves as the Secretary's principal advisor on bioterrorism and other public health emergencies and coordinates the federal public health and medical response to disasters.

"NBSB members bring a broad range of

perspectives and experiences, and over the past four years, the board has helped us improve federal policies and practices in disaster preparedness and response," said Assistant Secretary Nicole Lurie. "I look forward to working with the new members as we forge ahead in helping communities across the country become more resilient to all hazards."

The board was created under the Pandemic and All-Hazards Preparedness Act of 2006 and chartered in May 2007. Since then, the board has provided recommendations on a variety of federal disaster preparedness and response issues. The issues include the effectiveness of the National Disaster Medical System and federal management of the research and development of medical countermeasures – the medicines, vaccines and equipment needed to protect society from bioterrorism and pandemic disease.

In addition, the board assessed the department's progress in integrating behavioral health into emergency preparedness and response activities. HHS incorporated the NBSB recommendations in the first federal disaster behavioral health concept of operations which ASPR recently released. The board also has recommended ways to improve the nation's ability to mobilize scientific resources quickly and comprehensively in support of public health emergency response.

By statute, the board has 13 voting members with a broad range of expertise in science, medicine, and public health. Additionally, there are non-voting members from federal and state government agencies as deemed appropriate by the Secretary.

Congratulations Dr. Bradley, we are proud of you! Thank you for representing Rady Children's and the young patients we serve.


### Updated Rady Children's Specialists Brochure

### Rady Children's Awarded CCS Pilot Project

In the fall of 2011, Rady Children's Hospital and affiliated physicians received one of five state-approved demonstration projects from the Department of Health Care Services, to manage the care for children covered by California Children's Services (CCS).

The primary goal of the pilot program is to improve health outcomes and care coordination for CCS-enrolled children in San Diego. RCHSD will begin the demonstration project by initially focusing on patients with cystic fibrosis.
