Medication Safety-Safe Use-Safe Storage-Safe Disposal

Situation: The prescription medicine abuse epidemic is a national concern, many people don't realize this affects children as well as adults.




Figure 1. Ingestion of Opioids and Narcotics Rady Children's Hospital-San Diego

According to Safe Kids Worldwide ¹ every 9 minutes a child (under the age of 6) goes to the ER because they got into medicine, every hour a child is hospitalized, every 12 days a child dies. National statistics reveal that 3000 children were poisoned by opioids, 60% were less than 5 years old, almost all were ingested in the home. The number of opioid prescriptions filled in the area correlated with the exposure². In a recent 2 year period 39 children were admitted to Rady Children's Hospital for the ingestion of an opioid or narcotic (figure 1). This primarily occurs in curious young children gaining unsupervised access to medications and older children experimenting with their medications found in the home³. Solutions:

How does a child gain access to medication?

- ⇒ packaging is child resistant, not child proof, medication is often replaced in another container and can look like candy
- ⇒ medication is stored in hand bags or on the kitchen sink within reach of children.
- ⇒ Pills fall out of someone's pocket and children find them on the ground or in
- ⇒ Unused or expired medications are not disposed of properly
- ⇒ Medicines should be locked in a cabinet out of sight



Reduce the amount of opioid medications prescribed. Physicians around the country are changing their prescribing patterns and new regulations are in place to limit the amount of medication available. Alternate choices for pain relief are being utilized more frequently.

Store all medication as you would any potential poison. Don't let convenience trump safety. Keep medications out of reach and out of sight. For older children this can mean keeping in a secure place in a locked container.

Dispose of all unused medication by crushing and mixing with cat litter or coffee grounds. Drop off unused medications at a drop off event or drop box at selected pharmacies. April 28, 2018 is National Take Back Day for unused medications. See the attached flyer for the 40 take back locations across San Diego county.
