Encourage your child to use both of their hands during everyday activities; one hand for stabilization and the other hand for manipulation. Your child can help open play doh containers using two hands (one hand to hold the container and the other to remove the lid). RESEARCH CORNER

AIM HI— Dr. Lauren Brookman-Frazer and her UCSD and CASRC colleagues were recently awarded a 5-year, \$3.25 million study from the National Institute of Mental Health entitled, *Effectiveness and Implementation of a Mental Health Intervention for ASD*. The purpose of this randomized controlled trial is to test the effectiveness of a mental health intervention for children aged 5-13 with autism spectrum disorders (ASD) who exhibit challenging behaviors and are served in community and school-based mental health service settings. Participants include over 300 children receiving mental health services in San Diego County and over 200 therapists practicing in these settings.
