Day One: October 14, 2022

Participants will:

1. Describe why it is important to families that we apply anti-racist principles in our work.
2. Describe how power and privilege get in the way of providing care to our patients.
3. List three tools to provide culturally sensitive care to families.
4. Describe what families report are the biggest obstacles they must overcome in order to receive the care they want for their children.

Day Two: October 15, 2022
