Course Description

The goal of the symposium is to promote and advance the educational mission of the UCSD School of Medicine while building leadership capacity in medical and biomedical education. This 2nd annual symposium will provide an opportunity to engage faculty and trainees in new techniques in clinical education and medical education research.

Target Audience

This symposium is designed for health care professionals across all specialties, including faculty, residents, fellows, medical students, and administrative staff, wishing to learn more about the educational resources available at UCSD School of Medicine and innovations in medical education.

Needs Assessment

Medical education is a dynamic process that has to be refined periodically. Lack of innovative teaching techniques in academics makes medical curricula inadequate in making a significant stride towards the future. Further, there is no formal curriculum addressing teaching and learning in medical school education. In summary, there exists no forum by which foundational information regarding concepts and underlying theories regarding teaching and learning can be distributed to current UCSD School of Medicine faculty. Similarly, updates need to be provided to the UCSD School of Medicine faculty to ensure that faculty remain at the forefront of medical education.

Learning Objectives

- Apply modern techniques of teaching and learning to meet the needs of the modern medical education learner
- Relate teaching/learning methodologies to underlying educational theories so as to enhance curriculum development, teaching, and learning.

 - To state the reasoning behind using a conceptual framework when conducting medical education research
 - To develop educationally focused research aims
 - To associate educational aims and outcomes to appropriate medical education research designs
