

Most Common Types of Epilepsy in Children

- Childhood absence epilepsy
- Childhood occipital visual epilepsy
- Juvenile absence epilepsy
- Juvenile myoclonic epilepsy
- Photosensitive occipital lobe epilepsy
- Self-limited epilepsy with centrotemporal spikes
- Self-limited epilepsy with autonomic seizures
- Temporal lobe epilepsy

Epileptic encephalopathies:

- Dravet syndrome
- Developmental epileptic encephalopathy with spike-wave activation in sleep (DEE-SWAS)
- Epilepsy with myoclonic atonic seizures
- Infantile epileptic spasms syndrome
- Lennox-Gastaut syndrome
- Rasmussen encephalitis
